"The detailed designs will give a cost (for the signage and lines required with installation) which between your district councillors, Sandgate Parish Council and Sandgate Society is all at hand and ready to go.

"We're on course for installing this summer, after decades of trying. For every person that's worked, campaigned and petitioned for this: thank you.

Dom't Lose Your Vote

Over the coming months the Folkestone and Hythe elections team will start the process of contacting 16,000+ electors to reapply for their postal vote.

The Elections Act 2022 changed the way in which electors vote.

Previously, postal voters were contacted every five years to refresh their signature. Now postal voters must now reapply for their postal vote up to every three years.

If you vote by post currently, you will receive letters about this over coming months. Please respond as quickly as possible to ensure your postal vote is in place ahead of any pending election.

Outstanding work from Lee and the team on behalf of the District Council has turned it from swamp to bridge over (gently) running stream.

That's being followed by works to the path and springs feeding the stream on adjacent land by neighbours.

Tim has been approached by **Horn Street** residents about a 20mph
zone in the central section near The
Britannia pub. He's taking that up
with first Hythe Town Council, then
onto Kent County Council.

A broken bench on **Naildown Road** in Seabrook should soon be repaired by Hythe Town Council at Tim's request.

Tim has opposed an application to allow 24 hour lorry access to a site in **Caesars Way**, Cheriton past houses in **Cherry Garden Lane**.

Potholes blight our area. Tim spends loads of time reporting them to Kent Highways, including recently in Langdon Road and Hawkins Road, Cheriton & North Road, Sandgate. The only potholes they fix are the ones they know about. Anyone can, and should, report potholes when you see them.
